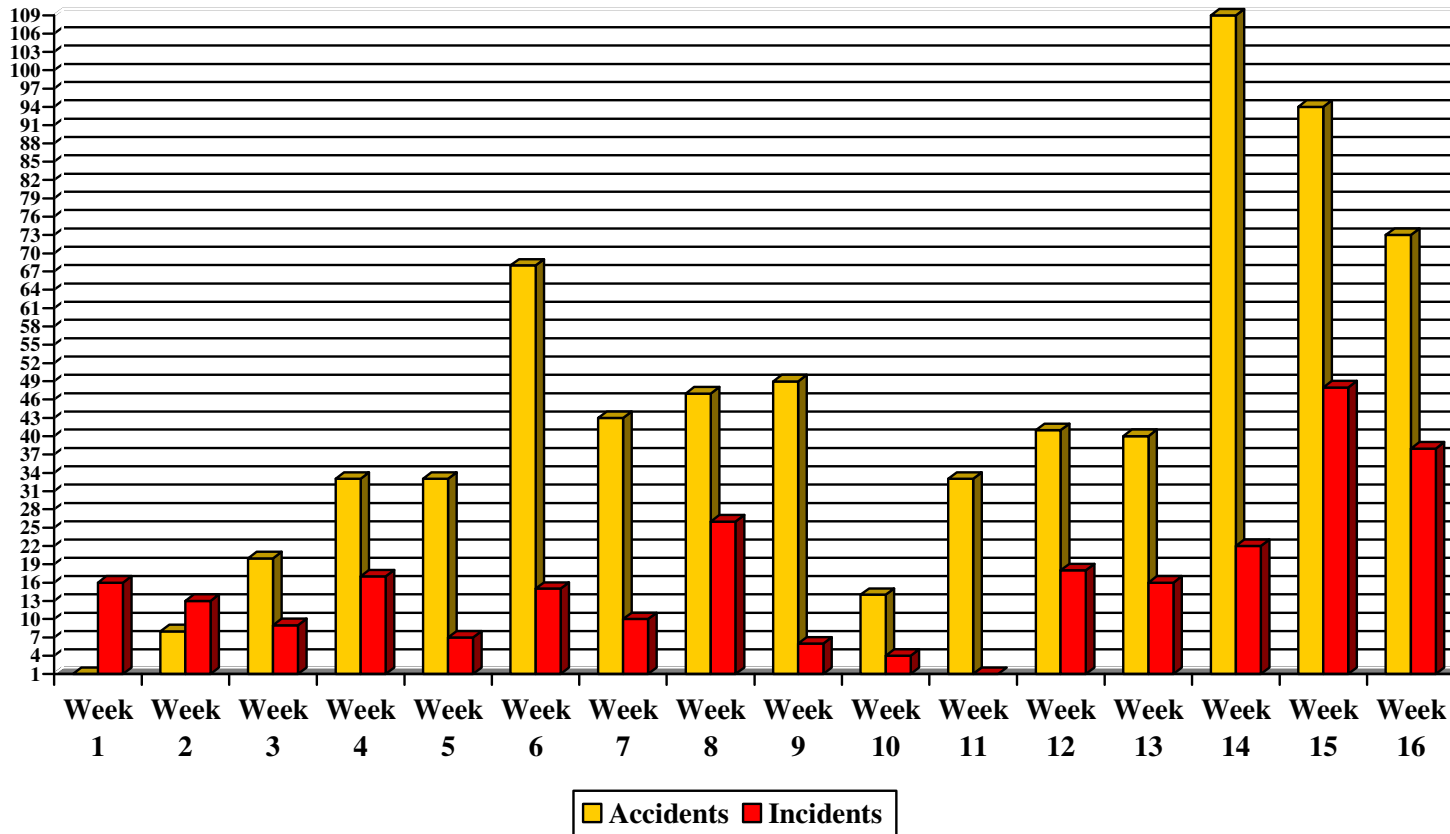

Weekly Accidents and Incidents Table



Week 1

Accidents

The reporting mechanisms were still not in place to report properly on accidents in the districts for the first week.

Incidents

- After vigorous discussion, the central Union of Islamic Court (UIC) committee agreed to allow SAACID to have full autonomy over the programme
- An individual claimed that he owned one of the garbage dumpsites. Negotiation failed, and the dumpsite was changed
- In Karaan District an old F1 grenade was found in the garbage. It was disposed of as per agreed procedures
- In Karaan District, on 12 August, 4 UIC militia stopped the work for a few hours. After the involvement of local elders and the local UIC they were allowed to continue the work
- In Abdul-aziz District, the total number of workers present at the worksite for the week was 80 workers - 20 workers less than the required number. The lower number was caused by the continuous harassment and interference of the UIC.
- In Shibis District, the first 2 days of the programme were really a mess, with the local UIC demanding total involvement in the programme. Finally a compromise was reached, and the local UIC was involved in the selection process for the 100 workers in this district. The workers worked at the Monopoly Market.
- In Bondhere District, the selection of the workers in this district was significantly disrupted by the local UIC. This included the imprisonment of the local District Commissioner (DC) for 1 day. He was then chased away by the local UIC. The UIC was claiming total district authority in Bondhere. The original 100 workers that were selected by the district committee were annulled and the UIC chose a new 100 workers to participate in the programme. SAACID suspended the programme in Bondhere to give as much support to local civil committees as it could. SAACID took the position that the UIC had a popular security mandate, but did not have a mandate to take over the running of districts in the city. After extensive discussions with all parties, it was agreed to allow the original 100 workers to participate in the programme; and the Bondhere DC was allowed to return to manage the programme for Bondhere.
- In Wardhigley District, the workers exposed the body of a dead person in the garbage. The body was properly reburied by the district committee.
- In Yaqshid District, the local UIC created a lot of problems with regard to the selection of the participants in this district. The Yaqshid local committee have said that they still do not have a final list that would satisfy SAACID, as they are still negotiating with the local UIC on the issue.
- In Yaqshid District, Some of the tools have been looted by local UIC militia; and the local UIC is now denying that they have taken anything. The local committee are still negotiating to get a return of the tools that have been taken.

- In Daynile District, an incident occurred between 2 militiamen - who were looking to get jobs on the work sites - and the managing DC. The incident was resolved peacefully.
- In Dharkeynley District, UIC militiamen took some on the district's tools. The local UIC was demanding to see the contract between SAACID and the local committee; as they had heard that ILO was paying US \$4 per day per person; but SAACID and the district committee was only paying the local workers US \$2 per day. The UIC was demanding that SAACID-Somalia's Country Director bring the contract to their offices. SAACID has refused to do so for security reasons. SAACID has given an open invitation to the Dharkeynley UIC to meet and discuss the issue at SAACID's compound. At the end of the first week the Dharkeynley UIC had not done so.
- In Shingani District, there were large demonstrations by many people at the commencement of the 1st week of activities in this district. People were not satisfied with the style of the selection process; and the demonstrations were to highlight significant public displeasure. These issues remain unresolved and work has been suspended for the full week.
- In Shingani District, there was also an issue relating to the leadership of the district. There are now 3 people claiming to be the DC of the district. Negotiations have led to a stalemate in the district. These issues remain unresolved and work has been suspended for the full week.
- In Hawl-wadag District, the local UIC is demanding complete control of the programme in this district. SAACID has taken the position that this is acceptable interference in the programme, and has refused the local UIC demands. Negotiations continued all week; but implementation activities did not occur at all in this district this week.
- Bermuda is not a district of Mogadishu. It is a very impoverished area of the city where marginalised clan minorities reside. SAACID lobbied to make this a special area, equal to a district, because the communities in this area normally never receive any benefit from international programming. The area is badly divided amongst many minorities. It is taking a lot of organisation to make sure that all minorities living in the area have the opportunity to participate in the programme. Managerial expertise that would have normally been applied to the organisation of Bermuda had to be instead applied to the many problems caused by the UIC. SAACID expects the Bermuda area to have their 100 workers selected for the second week of the programme.

Week 2

Accidents

- One injury was reported in Abdul-aziz District, when a beneficiary named Mukhtar Ahmed injured his left eye. One of the nurses assigned to the district administered immediate first aid; and he was helped to go to a doctor for more specialised assistance. Currently, he is still resting in bed.
- Three minor accidents (caused by tools) were reported and treated by nurses on site. They returned to work after being treated.
- In Heliwaa District, one person fell off a truck and sustained minor injuries.
- In Wadajir District, one of the labourers was injured when a pickaxe slipped and hit him. He has a serious wound to his right leg; and he has been given sick leave.

- In Wardhigley District, 2 labourers complained of having allergies from the garbage and were having itchy eyes. They were advised that only clean water was available to relieve the itchiness.

Incidents

- Problems with the local UIC continued into the second week. In the first week, the UIC had placed the Bondhere District Commissioner (DC) into jail for a day. After SAACID had negotiated for his release, the local UIC banished him from the district. The UIC was claiming that it should control the management of the programme in their district. SAACID then suspended the work in the district until the DC was reinstated. After heavy negotiations, the DC was reinstated and retained managerial control of the programme for his district.
- A conflict between one of the track contractors and SAACID and the monitoring engineers in Hamar-weyne District emerged. The truck owner was claiming that he was twice the volume that the engineers were estimating. He was warned that if he did not meet the expectations of SAACID and the monitoring engineers, he would lose his contract. He agreed to meet the outputs set for him.
- In Hawl-wadag District, an ongoing conflict between local civil district leaders and the local UIC continued into the second week in Hawl-wadag. The local UIC is demanding control of the management of the programme in that district. The local district leaders thought they had solved the problem and worked from 13-15 August, but the UIC then again intervened and said that they disagreed with the selection process. Work was again suspended in the district.
- In Hodan District, local militia caused some problems early in the week, but the local leaders were able to resolve the conflict.
- In Heliwaa District, there were problems with the 2 trucks that were contracted for the district. It is hoped that the problem will be resolved in a workshop to be held on 24-5 August.
- There are now 3 people claiming that they are the legitimate DC for Shingani district. No solution to this issue has thus been found. SAACID held negotiations with the UIC religious leader designated for the district. As he is not from any clan residing in the district, he was unwilling to intervene. He told SAACID that either they find a solution for the problem; or they take over the management of the programme in the district until a solution could be found. SAACID agreed to take over the management of the programme in the district, so that the district should get some benefit from the programme.
- A large mortar was found in the garbage in Shibis District.
- A G3 grenade was found in the garbage in Karaan District.
- In Warberi District, local UIC militia stopped the work on one occasion. The reason seemed to be that they wanted to extort some money from the programme. After discussions with local district leaders the matter was resolved.
- In Wadajir District, the local district leaders bought a budget from the local UIC demanding funds to rehabilitate the meat and vegetable market that they were clearing. The district leaders were informed that there was no budget for such an activity.
- In the Yaqshid District, a total of 100 beneficiaries have finally been agreed upon for the district. This was not without incident though, as the local UIC again attempted to interfere in the programme – arguing that they had to have full managerial control. A further series of negotiations between SAACID, local civil district leaders and the local UIC appear to have resolved the problem; and the civil district leaders retain managerial control for the programme.

- An F1 grenade was uncovered by a bulldozer preparing one of the dumpsites (Halane).
- More problems have occurred over 'ownership' of dump sites. Significant negotiations between SAACID, district leaders, monitoring engineers and claimants have now secured sites that do not appear to be claimed by anyone.

Week 3

Accidents

- Two workers were slightly injured with spades in Abdul-aziz District.
- An unspecified number of workers were injured by sharp metal in the garbage in Dharkeynley District. The wounds have immediately been infected. No workers were reported absent from work though.
- Four workers were reported injured in Hamar-jajab District. Two people suffered cactus thorn injuries; while 1 was hit with an axe; and another was hit with a spade.
- Two workers were reported injured Hamar-weyne District. The first was cut by glass; and the second was stabbed with a needle.
- Two workers were injured with spades in Hawl-wadag District.
- Two injuries were reported in Heliwaa District. One person fell off the back of a truck; while a second person was bitten by some sort of animal which caused his hand to change colour.
- Two injuries were reported in Karaan District. A piece of wood wounded both people.
- Two accidents were reported in Shibis District. One person was hit with a folk in the eye; and the other was hit with a folk in the leg. Both had 3 days off.
- Three accidents were reported in Wadajir District. Two people were hit with folks; and one had an old nail pierce her foot. There is a worry of tetanus; and the district is asking for ADT shots. SAACID will refer this to ILO for consideration.

Incidents

- Harassment was caused by 2 separate UIC militias claiming that they control the area in Heliwaa District, and this caused some minor disruption.
- Work was suspended for 1-day in Warberi District because of a dispute with the local UIC. After negotiations, the dispute was solved.
- There continues to be tension between the local UIC and the local civil leaders in Wadajir District over who should control the programme. The dispute has not stopped work though.
- Seven of the workers were sacked in Wadajir District for dishonesty and not performing their work properly.
- One hand grenade was found in garbage in Wardhigley District.

- Contrary to the regulations of the selection criteria of the beneficiaries, Wardhigley District leaders included one young pregnant woman in their list. Unfortunately, the young girl aborted a small embryo and has been taken to the hospital. Her young husband has been included in the list of the workers in her place.
- There was a conflict between a SAACID monitor and the DC of Wardhigley District. After long negotiations, SAACID decided to switch the monitor with another monitor from Shibus.
- A local UIC work party came to the Bermuda area and said that they controlled the area. After negotiations, the ILO Bermuda workers continued to work at the site and the UIC faction left.
- Keysaney Hospital complained to SAACID that the truck contractors were dumping garbage near the hospital. However, KEI engineering, who are one of the stakeholders of the programme, cleared SAACID from suspicion and confirmed that SAACID's truck contractors' were properly dumping their garbage at the agreed dumpsites. It has been found that UIC trucks are dumping garbage anywhere. SAACID is unsure if this is a deliberate attempt to try and discredit the ILO Employment for Peace programme.

Week 4

Accidents

- One person in Abdul-aziz District was injured with a fork while working
- Two people from Bondhere District were pierced by thorns, causing swelling and irritation
- Three people were injured during the work in Dharkeynley District. One woman was hit with a fork, while two men were cut with a pickaxe and a broken bottle respectively.
- Three people were cut by broken bottles sustaining in Hamar-jajab District
- Three people of Hamar-weyne District - one woman and two men sustained injuries during the week. The woman hit herself with a pickaxe; while the two men were cut by broken bottles and an iron scrap respectively.
- One woman and 1 man were injured in Hawl-wadag District. The woman was injured with a spade while the man sustained injury on the foot.
- One female worker was injured by a bucket in Hodan District. Her injury developed an infection. She took a short leave but brought her daughter to work in her place.
- A woman was bitten by black ants and sustained swelling from the bite in Heliwaa District
- A man fell from a truck during the loading of garbage in Heliwaa District, but did not sustain any serious injuries. However, the cause of the incident is attributed to the drivers of the trucks hastily driving the trucks without any care for the workers, and any agreement from the monitors.
- Two persons were cut by a broken bottle in Karaan District
- One of the workers in Shingani District. He was pierced by a thorn in a vein during work. He lost blood but was cured later by a nurse working at the site.

- Two people sustained slight injuries during work in Shibis District. One was hit in the knee, while the other received a wound on the head.
- Three people sustained injuries from Warberi District this district
- Two people received slight injuries during the work in Wadajir District this week
- One woman was bitten by a snake in Wardhigley District; while 2 other men were cut with broken bottles
- A young worker in Yaqshid District was hit on the head with a spade
- Three workers in the Bermuda area were pierced with thorns and the nurses met difficulties in stopping the bleeding until they gave the people injections for the blood loss.

Incidents

- The local Deynile District civil leaders complained that the UIC are demanding total managerial control of the programme in that district. SAACID has given the local civil district leaders and the local UIC 1 week to solve the problems; otherwise SAACID would close the operations in the district.
- The workers of Dharkeynley District unearthed a bomb and rifle grenade (FAL rifle type)
- The hand of a dead person was exhumed from the garbage in Dharkeynley District
- Dharkeynley District had problems with the local UIC in the district. The UIC want to add more people in the programme (another 40 person), which was not acceptable to the programme at this stage, as there is no budget for more people.
- There was a small incident in Hamar-jajab District on 30 August, when a few young children entered the worksite and were chased away by the workers. The families of the children, enraged by the act, came to the site armed with sticks and clubs. The families and the workers started fighting, until a UIC militia arrested 4 people and pacified the existing tension. A few hours later the problem was solved and all were released.
- The monitors of Hamar-weyne District noticed 3 pregnant women working in the garbage removal. They raised the problem to the district leaders. The 3 women realized the seriousness of the situation and accepted being replaced.
- Two women were swept away by flooding water through a watercourse in Heliwaa District, as a result of the recent heavy rains here in Mogadishu. The two women were rescued by other workers.
- Karaan District has a new problem with the local UIC. The local UIC is demanding that another 20 people be added to the programme - or they will bring a completely new 100 people - or they will stop the programme completely. This has created a dilemma within the community. SAACID continues to insist that no more people can be added to the programme. We will not know what will happen in the coming weeks in this district.
- There was a misunderstanding between the local UIC and SAACID in Shingani District. The issue was over pairing district workers. After explanation, the UIC backed off.
- One of the trucks working in Shingani District fell into a flooded ditch, because of the recent heavy rain. It took the workers sometime to pull the out truck.
- The workers exposed an anti-tank rocket in Wadajir District (P10 type). The rocket did not explode and was collected by SAACID staff.

- The Wadajir District still has some misunderstandings with the local UIC on the issue of the worker list for the EFP programme. The UIC is claiming worker places, while the civil district leaders decline to concede.
- One truck in Wardhigley District failed to meet the conditions laid out for his contract. He was sacked and a new truck was hired in his place.
- Yaqshid District had one extra person on the list of the beneficiaries. The problem was solved after SAACID clearly objected to this additional person.
- While Yaqshid District workers received their 2-week payment, 4 women completely covered their faces and refused to uncover their faces in order to see whom the cashier was giving the money to. After a long discussion the problem was solved. SAACID is now worried about what will happen after asking them to bring photos of such women.
- The recent autumn rains dumped garbage from other areas of neighbourhoods that had not been cleaned to areas that had been cleaned.
- Heaps of sand and mud that collected by the UIC was dumped onto the streets previously cleaned by SAACID/ILO programme beneficiaries. The workers had to repeat their work and shovel away the sand to make the streets drivable again.

Week 5

Accidents

- One youngster from Abdul-aziz District injured his hand with a fork sustaining a very significant inflammation on his hand. The youngster was taken to Keysaney Hospital.
- Three people received minor wounds in Bondhere District
- Three people were injured in Deynile District – 2 with forks and 1 with a machete - and they received medication
- SAACID tested 1 of the Deynile District workers at its TB clinic in Abdul-aziz, and he was found to be TB positive. He is now on a 3-month TB drug programme.
- One of the workers of Dharkeynley District was seriously injured when she was pierced by a needle on the left hand that emitted a lot of blood. Five other people in the district were slightly wounded by different working tools.
- One of the workers from Hamar-Jajab District became sick with bad diarrhoea during this week
- Six persons were allowed to bring substitutes in their place in Hamar-jajab District, because of the age issue, constant pain, and other excuses
- Two people sustained slight injuries in Hodan District - one was hit with a pickaxe while the other was hit with a bucket
- Two people sustained injuries on their hands when broken glass hidden in the garbage cut them in Heliwaa District
- One person fell in a state of unconsciousness while loading the truck in Karaan district. The nurses working at the site diagnosed him and found out that the person suffered some an epileptic disorder previously. The nurse sent the patient to a hospital.
- Three people sustained slight injures during the week in Wadajir District
- Two people received minor wounds in the week in Wardhigley District
- Two people sustained slight injuries during the week in Yaqshid District

Incidents

- Small disputes were been reported from the worksites, when the workers of one district claimed that the other district wasn't working hard enough. SAACID site monitors and the district leaders solved the disputes and they assigned each worker a particular place in order check the outputs.
- Wardhigley District was working with Deynile District on the road between Ali Kamin and Bar Ayaan. This area is a dumping ground for malfunctioning ammunition by weapon sellers – particularly mortar shells. This week, SAACID monitors reported that they had received 2 bombs and 2 mortars found inside the garbage; and other shells were looted by the workers to sell for scrap.
- The recent rains dug deep channels in some of the roads in Hawl-wadag District, which had had the garbage cleared from them and had become exposed to the elements. This caused difficulty for transport in the area.
- Karaan District has a conflict with the local UIC, who are requesting an addition number of beneficiaries be added to the programme. The argument still persists; however, the work is running smoothly at present.
- One of workers created a disturbance within a worksite in Shingani District by dipping his legs into a container of drinking water. The person was accused the local UIC took him to jail. The person was later released and reported to work under a strict warning from SAACID and the district leaders that a repetition of the incident would deprive him of any further participation in the programme.
- Some of the residents of the areas where garbage was being cleaned in Shibis District, refused the removal of the garbage accumulated on the pavement, claiming that the removal of the garbage would expose the drainage ditch
- Wadajir District witnessed many problems during the week. The main issue troubling the district revolved around the job descriptions of the district leaders - where 2 people are contending for the position of the First Deputy DC of the district. The issue caused protracted delays in the work. One of the persons claiming the position stole the working tools – storing them in his house. He refused to hand over the tools to SAACID monitors present in the district. Finally, SAACID head office intervened and convinced him to release the tools. SAACID also solved the power conflict of the district with the assistance of the Deputy Governor and Mayor - Mr. Frinbi – who is really doing a fine job.

Week 6

Accidents

- Three workers sustained small injuries from thorny trees growing in Bondhere District
- Three workers sustained slight injuries from thorns and the working tools in Deynile District
- Ten workers sustained various injuries during the week in Dharkeynley District - caused mainly by sharp objects hidden in the garbage (particularly needles) hidden in the garbage
- Three workers sustained injuries during the work caused mainly by hits received from the working tools - like the spades and the forks in Hamar-jajab District

- One woman was injured by a bucket while loading a truck in Hamar-weyne District
- In Hawl-wadag District 11 workers were reported lightly injured by thorn trees and cactus
- Three workers sustained injuries - caused by the working tools in Hodan District
- Six workers were reported absent during the week in Heliwaa District - mainly for sustained injuries or other sicknesses. One young man was hit on the head with an iron rod while loading the truck
- Three workers were slightly injured by the working tools in Shibis District
- Five people sustained slight injuries caused by hidden needles and broken bottles, as well as razorblades in Waberi District - the area had many pharmacies in the past
- Three people were lightly injured by thorn trees during the week in Wadajir District
- The worksites in Wardhigley District are full iron scrap, thorns and broken glass that pierce the workers on the legs and hands. Seventeen workers were injured in this work this week.

Incidents

- The workers exposed 7 grenades from the garbage in Hamar-weyne District
- The local district leaders experienced minor disagreements with the Union of Islamic Courts (UIC) over the number of workers given to Karaan District. The local district UIC was demanding the addition of an extra 27 workers that would report to the UIC. The local district leaders rejected the request. Finally, SAACID intervened and told the UIC that the programme cannot be amended to add more people at this stage. Finally the UIC accepted the words from SAACID and stopped interfering.
- The workers exposed 3 grenades from the garbage in Shingani District
- One of the workers placed his feet in the drinking water container in Shingani District. In addition, he also made problems with the workers and created an unpleasant environment at the worksites. UIC security caught him and took him to prison. It was some hours before SAACID could get him released. SAACID counselled him and now he is calm and doing his work well.
- This week Wadajir District experienced a lot of intervention from the local UIC – which is demanding that 27 people of the UIC’s choosing replace 27 current workers. When they tried to implement this idea, it created a conflict between SAACID, the local district leaders and the local UIC. SAACID is insisting that the 100 workers have already been chosen and their names given to ILO – no further changes are allowed – except for serious injury. The work has stopped, as the UIC is not accepting this.
- The workers exposed significant numbers of human remains (hands and legs) during the work at the area near General Daud Cemetery in Wardhigley District. In fact, many of the human exposed bodies were not buried perfectly and put down very close to the surface.
- One of the trucks working with Bermuda Enclave accidentally killed a person on the road while coming back from Halane dumpsite. The driver of the truck was arrested and the case is under investigation.

Week 7

Accidents

- In Bondhere District, 2 people were slightly injured from a spade and a machete; they were given first aid by the attending nurses and immediately returned to work
- In Deynile District, 3 people sustained slight injuries from cactus thorns - affecting their eyes; and some working tools also caused injuries to 3 more workers
- In Dharkeynley District, 2 people were injured when they fell into the huge garbage heap. One of the 2 was seriously injured, and was sent to hospital; but now he is quite fit, and is working normally
- In Hamar-jajab District, 1 person sustained an injury during the work, when hit with a working tool
- One person in Hamar-weyne District was pierced by a sharp broken bone hidden in the garbage. The first aid nurse gave aid, and the woman returned to work
- In Hawl-wadag District, 2 people became sick when they drank water without chlorine, but after taking more fresh water, they returned to health
- In Hodan District, 2 people were injured during the work - caused by being struck by a spade and a bucket
- In Heliwaa District, 2 people were injured during the week - 1 was pierced with a fork, which was lying on the ground; while the other was wounded by the back door of the truck while the workers were loading the truck
- In Karaan district, 1 of the workers felt sick, showing symptoms of diarrhoea, when he ate food without washing his hands during lunchtime
- In Shingani District, 2 people sustained slight injuries caused by the working tools
- In Shibis District, 7 people were slightly injured by thorn trees that occupy the major parts of the city
- In Warberi District, 6 people were slightly injured - caused by working tools and sharp objects in the garbage
- In Wadajir District, 2 people received injuries during the week
- In Wardhigley District, 3 people received injuries from thorn trees and cactus
- In Yaqshid District, 3 people sustained slight injuries from: a working tool, broken glass hidden in the garbage, and a needle
- In the Bermuda enclave, 1 person felt some sickness similar to diarrhoea

Incidents

- The workers of Deynile District unearthed an unexploded bomb, which was taken by the local Union of Islamic Court (UIC) militia
- In Hamar-jajab District, the local UIC confronted the work group at Raage Ugas School. The local district leaders and SAACID resolved the stand-off by moving to a new work site in the district.
- In Hamar-jajab District, 2 unexploded hand grenades were found in the garbage

- In Hamar-weyne District, Bile Mohamed Arif and Asha Mohamed Islow married after a long courtship. Working in the EFP programme has provided them with the salary to get married.
- The workers in Hamar-weyne District found 2 Egyptian made bombs in the garbage. They were taken by the local UIC militia
- In Shingani District, workers found 2 dead people folded in a Saudi mat in the garbage. The remnants of the two bodies were not recognizable and were mere bones. The workers were shocked at the dreadful scene but finally they buried the fossils near the worksite.
- In Wadajir District, The local UIC wanted to register new people for work, in the place of those previously registered by community leaders. SAACID totally rejected the local UIC push to take control of the programme in Wadajir District. In retaliation, the local UIC stopped the work in the district. SAACID declared that the district workers would unfortunately lose the opportunity of receiving the salaries that are available for a fixed 4-month period; and the district would suffer because they would lose working days to clear the garbage in their district. Large numbers of community leaders then went to the local UIC and demanded the reinstatement of the original workers. The local UIC agreed to back off, and the original workers were allowed to continue the work.
- In Wardhigley District, the workers exposed a bomb from the garbage and it was taken by the local UIC militia

Week 8

Accidents

- Two of the workers in the Bermuda enclave were injured by a rusted blade and a broken mirror
- A total of 3 people were wounded in Wardhigley District while they were dragging garbage from under a tree; but now they are okay
- Two of the workers in Yaqshid District injured slightly when they were loading the trucks
- Two people were pierced by needles in Wadajir District
- A total of seven people were injured this week in Warberi District – mainly in the legs and hands, caused by the enormous trees and cactus thorn
- Three people sustained slight injuries during the week in Shibis District
- Two of the workers were slightly cut by rusted blades in Shingani District, and SAACID site nurses gave an anti-tetanus injection; and now they are working well
- One of the workers in Karaan District pierced his right leg on broken glass - now he is okay
- Two of the workers were injured in Heliwaa District when they were hit with a spade and fork respectively
- Four workers received slight injuries in Hodan District caused by broken glass, thorns and sharp objects in the garbage
- Two workers were pierced in their eyes with thorns of a cactus tree while they were clearing the cactus in Hawl-wadag District
- A total of three people were wounded by working tools in Hamar-weyne District - one of them seriously wounded, when a fork deeply pierced his right leg. The site nurses put some iodine fluid and stitched the wound, and now he is working nicely.
- Three people received slight injuries in Dharkeynley District, caused by needles and other sharp materials

- One person sustained a slight injury in Hamar-jajab District when he hit himself with a fork he was working with
- Three people were injured during the work in Bondhere District - being pierced by different objects and working tools
- Five of the workers in Abdul-aziz District were pierced with different objects - like cactus, broken glasses, wood and tin

Incidents

- Wardhigley District uncovered a total of eight bombs and grenades this week
- The Wadajir District has been continuously harassed by the local UIC this week. The local UIC continues to use a variety of strategies to block work and pressure the local community leaders and SAACID to sack the current workers and place workers nominated by the local UIC. SAACID continues to refuse this extortion attempt.
- Site monitors reported that they received a total of 4 hand grenades from Heliwaa District, which were manufactured in the countries of Egypt, Italy, Russia and Bulgaria
- A bomb was unearthed in the garbage in Shibis District
- Two anti-tank shells were uncovered from the garbage in Hawl-wadag District and were handed over to SAACID site monitors - to hand later to a qualified explosive group based in Mogadishu; in the presence of the local media.
- The workers of Hamar-jajab District had a sustained confrontation with the Benadir Women Peace Vanguard (BWPV - *Haweenka Horseedka Nabadda Banadir*) – created by the UIC to be their nominated women’s NGO for UN and international donor programmes. The UIC is now more frequently mobilising some of the wives of their militia to come to worksites as the BWPV and harass the ILO EFP programme. On this occasion, the two groups started throwing stones at each other, until the local DC and UIC representatives intervened and pacified the situation. The ILO workers then moved to another worksite.
- In Deynile District, many explosive objects were found within the garbage. The UXOs included 5 hand grenades, 3 mortars and a bazooka shell

Week 9

Accidents

- Two people were slightly injured by the spade they working with in Abdul-aziz District
- One person went into shock in Bondhere District, but recovered and was given was day’s leave to take some rest
- Three people in Deynile District were pierced in the hands and legs by working tools
- Six people in Dharkeynley District sustained slight injuries caused by thorn trees covering the garbage accumulations
- Two people in Hamar-jajab District sustained slight injuries while loading the truck
- Three people sustained injuries in Hawl-wadag District from the thorns of the cactus
- Nine people sustained injuries in Hodan District from different materials hidden in the garbage

- Two people in Heliwaa District received slight injuries at the work sites this week
- One person in Karaan District was injured when a hidden nail pieced his leg
- Two people from Shingani District sustained slight injuries from rusting iron scrap and broken bottles hidden in the garbage
- One woman in Shibis District was hit hard on the hand, but recovered and continued to work
- Six people in Warberi District sustained slight injuries during the work this week
- Three people were injured during the week in Wadajir District. Two of those inured sustained wounds when they were hit with the working tools. The third was pierced with broken glass hidden in the garbage.
- One woman sustained a slight injury in Wardhigley District, when she fell while carrying a bucket of sand
- Four people received slight injuries during the week in Yaqshid District
- Three people in the Bermuda enclave received slight injuries while working during the week

Incidents

- The monitors at Heliwaa District report the unearthing of 2 UXOs this week
- Shingani and Abdul-aziz districts had an argument over which district had the right to clean the garbage in a boundary area. Ultimately, SAACID supervisors - knowing the real boundary between the 2 districts - persuaded both districts to work jointly in cleaning the garbage.
- Two machetes and 1 spade were reported lost in Shibis District
- Encountered constraints in Shibis District included the refusal of the Gedqaloc section of the district, who claimed that they had deliberately poured the sand accumulated on the pavement there for personal purposes and would not accept the removal of the sand
- Two men in Shibis District dumped 2 loads of rocks on the cleaned road behind the Saudi Arabian Embassy. The 2 men advised the district leaders not to invest any more effort in the area, because the place is somebody's property. The district leaders gave this information to the local UIC, who ordered the district workers to haul the rocks to the dumpsites. The issue is pending however, as no final decision would be taken without consulting SAACID's Country Director.
- The Wadajir UIC claimed that EFP trucks were illegally dumping garbage in their district, and detained the trucks accordingly. At the same time, the Wadajir UIC was demanding that SAACID include the wives of some of their militia in the programme. SAACID's Deputy Country Director went to the headquarters of the Wadajir UIC and provided the proof of the voucher system that SAACID created, and forced the Wadajir UIC to release the trucks - as the pick-up and dumping vouchers and receipts matched perfectly.

Week 10

Accidents

- Three people from the Bermuda enclave were injured by glass and needles

- Two people received slight injuries in Yaqshid District this week
- Two female workers were injured by forks in Shibis district this week
- Two people in Dharkeynley District were reported as injured this week
- Three people from Deynile District received small injuries from cactus and thorn trees during the week
- Two people from Bondhere District were injured by working tools - a fork and a spade

Incidents

- One of the families living in Shingani District in an area where work was being done threw stones at the workers. Then the workers clashed with the family and some of the workers and family members were injured. Then SAACID programme officers stopped and solved the problem. A few hours after the incident, the work was again running smoothly.
- The district of Hawl-wadag encountered some differences between SAACID site monitors and local district management team. The differences were over the truck-hauling system. Then SAACID programme officers solved the problem.
- In Deynile District a misfired bazooka shell was unearthed during the week
- Abdul-aziz District workers had a dispute with Karaan district over who should control the work site. Two workers nearly fought over the issue. SAACID intervened and solved the dispute.

Week 11

Accidents

- Three people sustained small injuries in Abdul-aziz District when they were hit with working tools
- Two people were slightly injured during the week in Bondhere District
- Five people received slight injuries during the week in Deynile District
- Eight people in Dharkeynley District were reported to have received slight injuries caused by broken glass, metal scrap and needles
- Two people in Hamar-jajab District sustained small injuries during the week
- One person from Hamar-weyne District sustained a slight injury during the working week
- One person from Hawl-wadag District was pierced with the thorns from a thorn tree while he was cutting the tree down
- Two people from Hodan District received slight injuries during the week
- One person from Heliwaa District slipped from the top of a truck while loading it with the garbage and hurt himself
- Three people in Karaan District were reported to have contracted some itching illnesses attributed to the dirty water settling in the muddy ditches and culverts crated in the cleaned road
- One person from Shibis District sustained a slight injury from a spade

- One person in Wadajir District sustained a small injury caused by a spade
- One person was injured during the week in Wardhigley District
- Two people from the Bermuda enclave were pierced by thorns and broken glass

Incidents

Week 12

Accidents

- There were 5 people who had health problems this week in Abdul-aziz District. A woman and a man sustained serious injuries. The woman was hit by a car that was driving on the newly cleaned road - seriously injuring her and breaking her left hip. The man was hit with a pickaxe on the right knee. He did not claim any pain at the time of the accident, but his wife reported that his knee had swollen badly over night; and the hospital reported that he had fractured some bones in his knee. Also a young male worker contracted diarrhoea and was given some vacation time so as to recover. Two people were also reported absent from work because of fever.
- Two people were lightly injured in Bondhere District from a fork and a spade while they were cleaning in the garbage
- Three people were injured slightly for tools in Deynile District
- A woman in Dharkenley District broke her left leg after being hit by a car and was sent to hospital for attention and care
- In Hamar-jajab District, 2 people sustained slight injuries while working. One of them was injured when the door of the truck that was being closed caught his hand.
- In Hamar-weyne District, 1 male sustained a bad injury when he was hit with a rock on the head - he was given sick leave for one day. While one female was injured when she was hit with a bucket and fainted. She was sent to a hospital for attention and care. She has not come back to work yet and reported having bruises on the head.
- Two people in Hawl-wadag District were injured during the week by working tools
- In Hodan District, a monitor and a worker fainted because of the heat and humidity
- Three people in Heliwaa District sustained slight injuries during the week
- Three people in Karaan District sustained injuries during the week
- In Shingani District, the garbage is mixed with small trees used for the decoration of the streets. The trees have white milky juice that causes allergic reactions with some of the workers. Six people have already registered complaints of itching hands and legs attributed to the said tree.
- Four people in Warberi District received different injuries during the work in the week. Two of them were cut with broken bottles; while 1 of the remaining 2 was hit with a pickaxe and the other with the spade.
- Six people in Wadajir District sustained injuries when the bones hidden in the garbage pierced them. The received injuries occur mainly at the hands and the legs.

- In Wardhigley District, 4 people were injured while they cutting thorn trees and cactus on the sidewalks of the road
- In Yaqshid District, 4 people sustained slight injuries during the working week. A woman slipped while carrying a holder full of waste and injured her knees. A man was pierced by a rusted knife hidden in the garbage and was injected with a tetanus injection. The 2 other were hit with working tools. No incidents were reported in this district this week.

Incidents

- There was an incident in Bondhere District between SAACID site monitors and the truck owners for carrying trees on their trucks, because the district was working in a place that has huge trees. The district cleaned already the heart of Mogadishu City centre, where the workers used to chop up the trees on site and burn them. Hence, the SAACID monitors told the truck owners that they should not load any trees unless the haulage was properly loaded – i.e., that the truck owners weren't using the tress to make easy loads. In the end the truck drivers agreed to the decision.
- In Deynile District, the residents near the worksite appealed to the workers to fill a big cavity that has been created by the recent rains. One of the monitors refused the request. Two youngsters from the residential area then attacked the monitor who was injured in the head - sustaining bruises and a swollen face and reddened eyes. The local Union of Islamic Court (UIC) militiamen then chased the youngsters from their residential area. They didn't find the youth.
- The Dharkenley District workers closed the working site to avoid work interruption from vehicles and pedestrians. The closed road created a new traffic problem. Youngsters refused to respect the temporary closure of the road, and drove fiercely – endangering many of the workers. As a result of the careless drivers, a car hit one of the working women while she was cleaning the road. The woman broke her left leg and was sent to hospital for attention and care.
- In Dharkenley District, one of the vehicles ignoring a road closure hit one of the large garbage piles. The worksite monitor stopped the car asking the driver why he ignored the sign showing the garbage removal operation. The driver and the monitor went to the local UIC. The monitor was arrested.
- In Dharkenley District, 5 different UXOs were exposed during the work. The found UXOs comprised of an unexploded bazooka shell, a 106 mm Jeep and 3 Russian and Egyptian made hand grenades.
- In Hamar-jajab, the local UIC office in the Hamar-jajab invited SAACID worksite monitors and the DC in order to specify future worksites. This new group of UIC was recently nominated for controlling district affairs.
- The workers in Hamar-weyne District found a Russian made empty ammunition magazine for automatic rifle that was hidden in the garbage
- In Hamar-weyne District, the DC and one of the SAACID site monitors were invited to go to the local UIC. The UIC requested that the DC and the monitors collaborate in the future with the local UIC. The previous UIC was recently taken over by a new group.
- Although all the truck contractors have agreed on the truck loading system, the drivers in Hawl-wadag District still insist that the garbage volumes loaded on their trucks is too large and heavy so they cannot haul 6 cubic metres. For instance, a woman, who is a SAACID site monitor in Hawl-wadag District, was taken to the local UIC, after the drivers alleged that she forces them to load extra garbage volume. The drivers claim that if they refuse the order of the monitor they will lose the day's payment where the acceptance of the order would cause

damage to their cars. They accused the woman of blackmailing them in this manner. One of the 2 trucks working in Hawl-wadag District abandoned the work contract as a result of such complaints, and another truck was engaged in its place.

- In Karaan District, the workers exposed the rusted shells of 2 F1 hand grenades without detonators during the week. The tow bombs were handed over to the local UIC militia in the district.
- An incident occurred at a Warberri District worksite when a vehicle owned by the UIC hit the sign of the SAACID worksite portraying the name of SAACID/ILO and the name of the district. One of the workers (a woman) hit the car with a spade. The driver of the hit car went to the nearest UIC; and came back with a substantial militia force. The monitor of the worksite was arrested instantly. The local UIC sent an emissary who solved the problem without further incident – with the monitor being released.
- One of the trucks working with the Warberri District fell into a drainage ditch while carrying a load of garbage to a dumpsite. The truck was pulled out by a bulldozer, which was assisting the workers in the garbage removal that day.
- The Wardhigley District has lately been having a fight with the local UIC over the issue of the loaded garbage - especially the moist sand. The local UIC requested the district authority and SAACID monitors to discharge the garbage loads to fill holes in the roads. SAACID site monitors rejected the idea. The local UIC then ordered the workers of the district to leave the site. The workers, after consultation with SAACID, transferred the work to another site.

Week 13

Accidents

- In Abdul-aziz District, 1 woman was hit with a spade during the work this week. She sustained a serious gash on the shoulder and was taken to a hospital. Her wound was stitched at 4 places. Another woman was hit with a bucket full of sand that fell from the truck during the loading process. Her injury was not serious.
- In Bondhere District, 2 people were hit by public transport vehicles travelling on the cleaned road. The injuries were not serious.
- In Deynile District, a total of 3 people were injured at the work sites this week. One of them was hit by a spade on his right leg; and another was cut by broken glass from the garbage; while the last person was hit by a fork when he was clearing garbage at the roadside.
- Three people sustained various injuries in Dharkeynley District this week
- In Hamar-jajab District, 1 woman sustained a slight injury when she was hit with a pick axe on the leg. Another woman fell into a ditch and sustained some bruises on the knee.
- In Hamar-weyne District, 1 man hit himself with a spade sustaining a slight injury. Another man was hit with a stone that was sticking to a fork. The stone was released and fell on the head of the man. One woman was hit with an empty bucket thrown from the truck during the loading of the truck. She sustained some swelling on the head but is alright now.
- In Hodan District, 1 woman was hit with a pickaxe on the left leg causing a big deep gash. She was treated by the nurse of the site and was given a holiday. Also, one man hit himself with an axe - sustaining a serious injury on the right foot. He was treated after he contracted an

infection. He is now well and is working with his colleagues as usual. One of the women workers contracted diarrhoea from the newly thrown waste and seriously sick with bad vomiting.

- In Hawl-wadag District, 3 people sustained injuries during the week. A man was hit on the thumb of the left hand and the nail came out. Another was hit with a spade on the right shoulder and he has been complaining of increasing pain on the ribs. He insisted on going for a medical check-up.
- In Heliwaa District, 1 man fainted because of the scorching sun and the hard work. He was taken to his house to rest for 3 days
- In Karaan District, 1 woman fell to the ground while carrying a bucket full of waste with another girl and hurt her left knee
- In Shingani District, 2 people sustained slight injuries. One of the 2 (a woman) fell on metal scrap lying on the ground and sustained some bruises on her left knee
- In Shibis District, 3 people sustained serious cuts on the hands and legs while removing the scarp metal. They still came to work and are feeling well at present.
- In Warberi District, many of the workers began suffering from (dhasse) insects entering their body. The workers usually sweat from the scorching heat and the insects stick to their bodies later. The workers then start itching and scratching their bodies creating swelling later. These insects reproduce on the body of the people causing continuous itching and pain. The workers usually treat the insects by burning them and treating the emerging wounds with ointments bought from pharmacies.
- In Wadajir District, 3 people sustained slight injuries - mainly from sharp bones and nails
- In Wardhigley District, 3 people were injured during the week
- In Yaqshid District, 5 people were injured during the week

Incidents

- The workers in Abdul-aziz District exposed 3 mortar shells from the garbage
- The workers in Dharkeynley District found 13 AK-47 bullets, but none of them was functioning
- In Hamar-jajab District, the workers found the dead bones of human beings that were hidden in the garbage
- In Hamar-weyne District, the garden near Arbaco Rukun, which was the cemetery of Hamar-weyne children, has been turned to a small farm by residents living near the garden. They have already sown maize and beans growing in the area with a fence of cut shrubs. The workers tried to clean the garbage from the place, but the self-styled owners of the small, farm rejected. The case has been forwarded to the local UIC. The workers and the monitors are waiting the decision of the UIC.
- In Hodan District, the driver of one of the trucks of the district fought with 1 of SAACID's EFP supervisors. He was immediately suspended from the work. The owner of the truck intervened employing another driver.
- In Heliwaa District, UIC militiamen patrolling the district visited the worksite and ordered the women workers to wear the vest showing the sign of ILO and SAACID under the hijab. They claim that the breasts and other parts of the female body will be eye-catching and is not

allowed according to Sharia law. The site monitors promised to pass the message to the workers. After a while the women workers started to wear the vest outside again, but when they saw more UIC militiamen they took off the vests again.

- The workers in Karaan District found 2 hand grenades hidden in the garbage on a sidewalk
- In Shingani District, the workers unearthed some human bodies in the garbage
- In the Bermuda enclave, the workers found 4 rusted F1 Italian made hand grenades and the shell of a misfired mortar in the garbage. The explosives were taken by the local UIC.
- A group claiming to represent the UIC went to Keysaney dumpsite with the intention of dumping garbage loaded on trucks. SAACID monitors stationed at the dumpsite refused to let the garbage be discharged in the dumpsite. The UIC militiamen accompanying the trucks went back and brought back more militia with them and they forcibly discharged the garbage at the dumpsite. The UIC militiamen then left the dumpsite, threatening the monitors at the site. The monitors reported the occurrence to SAACID's administration office. SAACID would contact the UIC, but has to first discover from which local court the militia came from.

Week 14

Accidents

- Five people in Abdul-aziz District were injured while clearing and hauling the accumulated garbage. One of the people was injured seriously when another woman working with a fork hit him, causing a deep wound that needed stitches.
- A total of 5 people were injured on different occasions by working tools in Bondhere District; 2 of them seriously wounded by hits received from forks and spades. One of them was wounded deeply by a fork in the right leg, causing a 4 cm wound. The site nurse stitched and bandaged the wound and sent the injured person to a hospital. He is reported to be recovering.
- In Deynile District, a total of 14 people complained of swelling, irritation and itching effects on their fingers. The workers attribute the problem of the itching and swelling to the irritating foul-smelling garbage.
- Two people from Dharkeynley District sustained slight injuries from the working tools
- In Hamar-weyne District, 6 people were injured while they were working in the garbage. One of the people was hit with a spade, while rusted iron scrap and other sharp items cut the other people.
- In Hodan District, 6 people received different injuries caused by broken bottles, rusted scrap iron and bones. The nurse at the site injected anti-tetanus into the injured persons.
- In Heliwaa District, 16 people sustained different injuries caused by the animal bones and the scrap iron hidden in the garbage. Those that were serious were injected with anti-tetanus.
- In Karaan District, 6 people received slight injuries during the week
- In Karaan District, 2 of the workers responded smear positive for TB to a medical examination after long serious pain. The 2 were registered as outpatients at SAACID's TB clinic.
- In Shingani District, 4 people received injuries from thorny trees

- In Shibis District, a driver, who seemed to be a learner, ignored the sign showing the ongoing garbage removal work, crushing 2 buckets and hit a woman worker. The woman is relatively okay.
- In Shingani District, 5 other people sustained slight injuries during the work
- In Warberri District, 12 people vomited and contracted ailments showing symptoms of diarrhoea during the work
- In Wadajir District, 4 people received slight injuries during working for incised animal bones and working tools
- In Wardhigley District, 10 people revealed symptoms of different ailments like diarrhoea
- In Yaqshid District, 1 old male employee showed TB symptoms and was found positive by SAACID TB clinic. He is now registered as an outpatient of the clinic.
- In Yaqshid District, 2 people received slight injuries from the working tools while in duty
- In the Bermuda enclave, 10 people received injuries from cactus thorns

Incidents

- The workers in Abdul-aziz District found a hand grenade and handed it over to UIC militiamen
- The workers in Bondhere District found 12 bullets from a G-3 and they handed them over to local UIC militiamen
- In Deynile District, a total of 3 bazooka shells and 4-misfired hand grenades were unearthed from the garbage and were handed to local UIC militiamen
- Two of the workers from Dharkeynley District fought each other using water during the last working hours
- The workers of Hamar-jajab District found 17 bullets in the garbage
- Hamar-jajab District was engaged in an affray with some of the district residents. The local UIC immediately contained situation, appealing to both sides to stop the quarrel; ordering the residents of the area to let the EFP workers continue their work.
- In Hamar-weyne District, the workers reported that they have found 3 mortar shells and 5 misfired bullets of G-3 and AK-47
- In Hawl-wadag District, 2 workers fought on matters concerning clan empathy. Some of the workers witnessing the brawl came to the assistance of the 2 - where each group sided with the person from their clan. The local UIC intervened immediately, arresting the 2 who started the brawl. The civil district leaders, accompanied by SAACID supervisors, contacted the local UIC holding the two workers, arranging for their release. The 2 workers were ordered to reconcile and avoid repeating similar mistakes in the future after their release from UIC custody
- In Hawl-wadag District, some unknown person or persons has been adding an unidentified drug to the water barrel of the workers. The workers that drank the water showed signs of drunkenness. The local UIC is investigating the incident. However, the people point the finger at some of the workers who are addicted to khaat, and who missed the flavour of the banned khaat.
- In Hodan District, a bus driver hit the ILO sign for the work erected at the worksite. The driver drove away without stopping.
- In Shingani District, the remnants of 3 dead bodies were unearthed from the garbage

- In Shibis District, a driver, who seemed to be a learner, ignored the sign showing the ongoing garbage removal work, crushing 2 buckets and hit a woman worker. The driver was stopped by local UIC militiamen and taken to the local UIC. The disagreement was concluded peacefully by the court - ordering the driver to compensate for the cost of the crushed buckets; and the cost of medication of the injured woman.
- In Wardhigley District, a worker exposed an F1 hand local UIC militiamen
- In the Bermuda enclave, the workers exposed 3 empty AK ammunition magazines from the garbage

Week 15

Accidents

- A total of 6 people from Abdul-aziz District received various wounds from the working tools. The forks and machetes used for cutting the trees damaged 2 of them seriously.
- Five people from Bondhere District sustained various injuries this week
- A total of 6 workers from Deynile District received injuries from thorn trees; while 2 of the workers fainted during work
- Four people were injured this week in Dharkeynley District
- Two women from Hamar-jajab District sustained injuries during the week. One woman fainted while carrying a bucket full of dirt. The other fell into a ditch receiving a big wound to her left knee. She has lost a lot of blood and was taken to a hospital for treatment.
- In Hamar-weyne District, 1 of the workers was attacked by a wild dog. The worker was taken to a hospital in order to be injected with anti-rabies treatment. Two other women received injuries - one was hit with a pickaxe; and the other was pierced by iron scrap.
- In Hawl-wadag District, 3 people were seriously wounded during the week. One of them sustained a severe injury on the finger; while another was pierced by a fork, and received 3 stitches as a result.
- In Hodan District, 3 people were injured during the hauling and the cleaning of the garbage
- In Heliwaa District, 16 people complained from itching symptoms and could not resist the stench of the garbage and vomited. SAACID monitors reported that some of them were bitten by insects coming out from the excavated garbage. Three others were pierced with bones and various sharp objects.
- In Karaan District, 6 people sustained injuries caused by working tools this week
- In Karaan District, 2 workers were found to be TB smear positive when they visited SAACID TB Clinic in Abdul-aziz District
- In Shingani District, 5 people were injured while cutting trees and hauling sand. Another worker fainted while she was carrying a bucket full of sand.
- In Shibis District, a total of 6 people were injured by the working tools this week
- In Warberi District, a total of 8 people were given medication because of itching and nausea that resulted from the foul smell and dampness of the garbage
- In Wadajir District, a total of 5 people were injured by different objects when they were removing the dirty sand

- In Wardhigley District, 3 women workers fainted during the work. One of the women vomited blood and showed thick foam on the mouth. She was taken to a hospital immediately.
- In Yaqshid District, 7 people received slight injuries while they were working

Incidents

- The workers of Abdul-aziz District unearthed 2 rust-eaten bombs without detonators
- The workers of Bondhere District have found bones - comprised of hands and legs buried hurriedly very close to the surface
- The workers of Bondhere District found various used ammunition shells - such as bazooka (1), AK 47 ammunition, anti-aircraft missiles (2), and some rusted automatic rifles (2)
- The workers of Deynile District also found 2 hand grenades from the garbage
- The site monitors in Dharkeynley District reported that the workers found 11 rust-eaten bullets from an Italian automatic rifle from the sand
- The workers of Hamar-jajab District found one bazooka shell that was hidden in the sand
- In Hamar-weyne District, 4 Russian-made hand grenades were found in the garbage and were taken by local UIC militiamen
- In Hawl-wadag District, 3 mortar shells were unearthed from the garbage and were taken by UIC militiamen
- In Heliwaa District, the monitors also reported that the workers found 3 misfired anti-tank missiles and 2 (sized 106 mm) shells of jeep type
- In Shingani District, 3 big shells from an anti-aircraft weapon were unearthed in the garbage
- In Warberi District the workers found 4 rust-eaten hand grenades from the garbage; and they were taken by UIC militiamen
- In Wardhigley District, the workers unearthed 3 hand grenades and one anti-tank missile from the garbage
- In Yaqshid District, 2 hand grenades and 2 shells were found in the garbage
- In the Bermuda enclave, 6 different bombs, including mortars, bazooka and anti-aircraft shells, were found in the area this week. Also, G3 and AK-47 bullets were found.
- In the Bermuda enclave, 1 of the workers was suspended from work for 2 days for his lateness
- A very interesting incident occurred on the 26th of November at Halane dumpsite. The owner (driver) of a truck (one of Hamar-weyne) found a newly born boy dumped at the site. The driver collected the child and reported the incident to SAACID office. He immediately, took the child to his wife, who was breastfeeding a newly born son. The wife started breastfeeding the found child. A team of SAACID staff visited the house of the driver and took photos and videotape of the child. One of SAACID's permanent staff, Mr. M. M. Foley, volunteered to bring-up the child, but the wife of the driver who already has 4 daughters insisted on keeping the boy as one of her children. SAACID ensured the sincerity of the family of the driver and approved the decision to keep the child.

Week 16

Accidents

- Five people were injured in Abdul-aziz District during the week from tool injuries. One of the workers was seriously injured when a spade hit him. The worker unfortunately lost a lot of blood. A nurse at the worksite stitched the wound and then sent the patient to his house.
- Four people in Bondhere District were injured in the week by different tools
- Three people (1 woman and 2 men) in Deynile District were injured during the week
- Seven people in Dharkeynley District received different injuries during the week
- In Hamar-jajab District, 3 people (one woman and two men) sustained injuries during the week
- In Hamar-weyne District, 2 of the workers were seriously wounded when they were loading the garbage hauling truck
- Nine people in Hawl-wadag District were injured in this district this week
- In Hodan District, 7 people sustained injuries in the district this week
- In Shingani District, 6 people sustained injuries during the week
- In Shibis District, 10 people were injured during the work this week
- A total of 8 people sustained injuries in Warberi District this week
- In Wadajir District, 6 people sustained slight injuries during the week
- In Wardhigley District, 3 women sustained injuries during the work this week

Incidents

- The workers of Abdul-aziz District unearthed 3 unexploded rusted hand grenades
- The area the Bondhere District workers were working in this week was turned into a graveyard during the civil war. The workers, tempted by superstitious beliefs were frightened from the appearance of ghosts that might curse them. This hindered the work a little bit, but the UIC encouraged the workers to have faith in Islam and throw off superstitious beliefs.
- The workers of Bondhere District exposed 1 bazooka shell covered with rust and sand
- Two Russian-made hand grenades were unearthed from the garbage in Deynile District
- In Deynile District, some of the workers fainted - attributing their sufferings to the superstitious believes of ghosts
- In Dharkeynley District, the workers found 2 unexploded mortars hidden in the garbage
- In Hamar-jajab District, the workers found 2 shells of 85 mm calibre in the garbage
- In Hawl-wadag District 2 RPG shells and 12 bullets from AK and G3 were unearthed from the garbage this week - as well as some rusted gun barrels
- Hodan District reported that the workers found the dead bodies of 2 infants aged about 2-3 years of age. The dead bodies were carried to another grave for burial
- In Hodan District, the workers found 4 rusted shells - including 1 hand grenade, 1 antiaircraft shell and 2 bazooka shells; also found were bullets of various calibres

- In Heliwaa District, the workers exposed 3 misfired Russian hand grenades
- In Shingani District, the workers found 2 exploded hand grenades. One was Egyptian and the other was Italian.
- In Warberi District, the workers found one 85 mm shell
- In Wadajir District, the workers exposed 3 misfired hand grenades; and they were taken by UIC militiamen.
- The workers of Yaqshid District entered into a row with the local UIC. The UIC ordered the workers of the district to demolish the makeshift kiosks built on the pavement of the road. The workers refused and told them that they will only clean places when the built kiosks are cleared away. One of the monitors, a female, got into hot discussions with the UIC, and resulted in a clash between them. The UIC later went away.
- The workers in the Bermuda enclave exposed 6 jeep shells in the garbage
- The trucks were working hard subject to regulations. However, 2 of the trucks operating in Deynile District were suspended when they were caught discharging the loaded garbage in places in the city, rather than the dumpsites. Another truck from Dharkeynley District was also discharged when he failed to carry the garbage volume required.
